GREAT ACTIVITY IN AIR

British Report Notes Particular
Aggressiveness of Foe

BRITISH FRONT IN FRANCE AND BELGIUM, Aug. 13.—(By the Associated Press.)—The British front in France and Belgium has been the scene of a series of attacks by the enemy, which have been repulsed with heavy losses. The British command has reported that the enemy has been particularly aggressive in the air, and that a number of their aircraft have been brought down.

TERRIFIC BOMBARDMENT. 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CRISIS AVERTED
BY LABOR'S SUPPORT
OF BRITISH PREMIERBarnes' Appointment Suits—
No Stockholm Passports.

NO ELECTION NOW LIKELY

Mr. Henderson Stoutly De-
fends Position Taken
at Conference.

LONDON, Aug. 13.—A day of great political excitement in London came tonight with the announcement that George Nicoll Barnes, minister of pensions, had been appointed to replace Arthur Henderson as labor member of the war cabinet. The appointment, according to a semi-official statement, has the approval of all the other labor members of the Government.

The government announced to Parliament today that the ministers had decided not to grant passports to delegates to the Stockholm conference. The decision was made after a long and heated discussion in the cabinet.

Mr. Henderson, in the House of Commons today, made an impassioned defence of his position in the conflict that has arisen between himself and Prime Minister Lloyd George.

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Financial, Market and Commercial Section

THE LOCAL MARKET

A further drop in oats was shown on the market this morning. The grain was offered in greater quantity, and a decline of 10 cents resulted, bringing the price down to \$2.20 and \$2.25 per cwt. and 78c per bushel.

Vegetables remained stationary, the general offering being comparatively small but of the usual good quality. Potatoes sold at 50c per bushel, but few were offered during the morning.

Tomatoes were the big thing on the vegetable market, the largest quantities yet seen being purchased readily in basket lots. Growers expect that the tomato will be the best vegetable to drop, and a price as low as 7c per pound is looked for within a short time.

Today marks the last raspberry offering of the season, with the exception of one or two late lots, which will be offered tomorrow, and prices went up as a consequence, the berries selling at 20c and 21c per box. The demand was rather poor for the late raspberries, but few were offered and every purchaser managed to sell his fruit before the close of the market. Cherries are no longer to be purchased, and no appearance having ended. This year was particularly good for cherries of all varieties, and no complaint can be registered against the quality.

Strawberries were relatively long time in abundance and good flavor. Red and black canning varieties at unchanged values today, the former variety selling at 15c per box and black at 20c and 21c in similar quantities.

Dairy produce and butchers' meats are unchanged, prices for butter and eggs are brisk while the demand for butchers' meats is unusually strong. The market for hams and bacon is quiet, and the expectation of the inauguration of the new year is not likely to affect the market.

Live hogs remain at the high price of 16c per cwt., and up to date show no likelihood of declining to any extent.
