


Bill to Be Presented at Ottawa to Make Things Plain.

OTTAWA, Feb. 18 .- The Canada Life Assurance Company has a bill before parliament which asks, among other parliament which asks, among other things, for a statutory interpretation of a law passed in 1879.

of a law passed in 1879. There are three provisions in the new bill. By one it is desired to change the date of the annual meeting to the first Thursday in February.

The second section reads as follows: The expressions, "all the profits realiz-ed from the entire business of the company," and "such profits," where used in chapter 71 of the statutes of 1879, were and are intended to denote the profits realized the company on Make Railways Build. It is explained that the second clause a the bill is intended to cover a con-troversy between the shareholders and policyholders in regard to the division of profits, the object being to make it clear that the policyholders' pro-fits shall be confined to the insurance profits of the year only and not in-clude interest earned on capital and reserve funds. The last clause gives the company power to hold additional real estate in Toronto and Ottawa.
