to the estimated and contract figures o fthe Hydro-Electric Power Commission in connection with the cost of the transmission equipment. In the parallel columns, where the figures are identical, the contracts have not yet been awarded, while the amount for "protective equipment" is a provision for further protection and is an addition to the original estimate.

The provincial treasurer stated yesterday that the prices for power which have been given to the municipalities were all based on the "estimated" cost of equipment and construction, and the saving which so far has been effected will inure to the benefit of those municipalities taking power from the commission:



CHICAGO, March 4 .- The Deering Coal Co. of Delaware, a \$5,000,000 corporation operating mines in Indiana and Illinois, was placed in the hands of a receiver to-day by Judge C. Kohlsaat, in the United States Circuit Court, on application of the Witt Mercantile Co., with a calim of \$2924. and Jackson K. Deering, owner of \$350,000 worth of the coal concern's stock. R. R. Hammond, president of the company, admitted that the corporation was in such financial straits as o make a receivership necessary. It is declared that the coal company

solvent, but that it is pressed by creditors to whom it owes a million dollars, and that it will be unable to meet the interest on its bonded indebt-edness. In the bill of complaint, it is alleged that various steel concerns owe the Deering Company \$215,000, which they refuse to pay becaus of differences arising between them and the coal company over damage calims.
