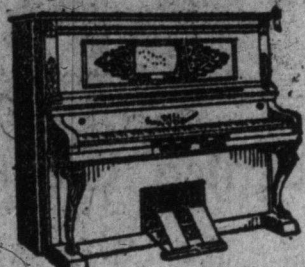

German Doctor Claims Tuberculosis "Cure"

Has Had Many Successes With Subcutaneous Injection of Non-Virulent Bacilli.

BERLIN, Nov. 20.—At a meeting of the Medical Society of Berlin, Dr. Friedrich Franz Friedmann said he had a cure for all forms of tuberculosis, including tuberculosis of the lungs and bones, and lupus.

Six hundred and eighty-two patients, he said, had been treated with the remedy, including 250 consumptives, and the results had been favorable. Dr. Friedmann claims practically a hundred per cent. of cures. A number of prominent physicians testified to the success of the remedy from their experience.

The nature of Dr. Friedmann's specific is withheld, but it consists, says Reuter, of a preparation of living, non-virulent bacilli, administered by subcutaneous, intravenous injection.

Over a thousand human beings have been inoculated without the least harmful results. The bacillus employed is the tuberculous bacillus rendered innocuous.

Author Named Six Conditions Which His Second Bride Was Required to Fulfil.

TOKIO, Nov. 20.—Mr. Ichiba, a well-known Japanese author, has just celebrated, under remarkable conditions, his second marriage. His first wife died in April last, and the mourning spouse immediately set about finding another partner.

He commissioned all his friends to keep their eyes open for him and gave a standing order to the various matrimonial agencies in the capital to report immediately any likely candidate for the honor of being the second Mrs. Ichiba. He laid down six primary conditions which the successful candidate would have to fulfil. They were:

The lady must have passed thru all the various conditions of life and the various phases of society, from A to Z, as only by ripe experience can perfection be attained.

Except the clothes she stand up in, she should have no worldly possessions whatsoever.

She must be severed from her family entirely.

She must contract to keep the kitchen and bathroom absolutely spotless and ready for instant use.

Her style of hairdressing must be a la mode Japanese—no foreign frills, pads, switches or toupets to be permitted.

SHALL SERBIA HAVE ADRIATIC SEAPORT?

Former Will Place No Obstacle In Way of Austria's Commercial Expansion, Says Premier Pasic.

PARIS, Nov. 30.—The question of mediation by the great powers between the Balkan allies and the Turkish Government has been overshadowed by a rapidly developing divergence of policy between Austria-Hungary and Serbia. The questions at issue between the governments of these two countries are:

Shall Serbia have a seaport on the Adriatic?

Shall Albania be created a separate, self-governing State?

What economic concessions shall Serbia make to Austria-Hungary?

Serbia desires an outlet to the sea on the Adriatic, and on the right to absorb Albania and it is stated on good authority, Bulgaria will support her in making good these desires.

Further, that Russia will go to the help of the Balkan States. Despite the emphatic manner in which Austria-Hungary has stated her objections, there is a possibility that she is only trying to "bluff" Serbia. If she is not, then the situation is extremely serious.

The Serbian attitude is indicated in the following interview with the Serbian Premier, M. Pasic. Asked what he thought of the mediation of Europe to put an end to the war, Pasic replied: "We would desire to settle our affairs and conclude the treaty of peace with Turkey ourselves. So long as the military operations are not terminated we have no need to discuss the question; besides, Turkey has not yet addressed herself to us. We wish her to address herself to us direct, for it will be easier to solve the question at issue between the Balkan alliance and Turkey without the interference of internationalists, who would be sure to bring in other questions of secondary importance to us. I believe the allied states will with cheerful acceptance mediate, unless their principal demands have been approved beforehand."

No Proposal from Austria. Asked if he believed in the possibility of an arrangement between Serbia and Austria-Hungary, the Serbian premier replied: "We have received no special proposal from Austria, but supposing that she has no desire for territorial aggrandisement in the Balkan States, and believing that she wishes to treat Serbia with the same sympathy as the other Balkan States, I can declare that Serbia will place no obstacle in the way of the commercial expansion, and will not reject her justified economic demands. But at this moment, when the independent development of the Balkan States is being prosecuted, when it is desired that these states should progress quickly, there can be no question of this Austro-Serbian union."

Those who hold that peace can be assured by the creation of an autonomous Albania deceive themselves. They have not properly weighed the possibility of a common status for the various Albanian tribes. These tribes still lead a primitive existence, devoid of culture; they are hostile among themselves, and believe that the Austro-Hungarian and Italian governments are supported in this standpoint by Germany. Serbia is anxious to see the Balkan States already existing. They also wish to assure the existence and independent development of the four kingdoms. Serbia, for instance, without an outlet to the sea, has no guarantee for her existence and economic development. Serbia demands the ports of San Giovanni, Alessio, Durazzo, which the Serb Empire possesses in the middle ages, and by which she was principally joined to the rest of Europe. In a word, we desire the partition of Turkey, Europe, leaving, however, the fate of Constantinople to the international decision of the powers."

No Port on Adriatic. On the other hand, it is stated in Vienna, on the highest authority, that neither Austria-Hungary nor Italy will ever allow Serbia to have a port on the Adriatic. This is definite, and the final decision of Austro-Hungarian and Italian governments is to recognize the dual monarchy as the victor in the Balkan league, and to the basis of a future friendship understanding with Serbia, she will not depart a foot from the principle that Serbia shall have no outlet on the Adriatic. As there is reason to believe that the Austro-Hungarian and Italian governments are supported in this standpoint by Germany, Serbia is anxious to see the Balkan States already existing. They also wish to assure the existence and independent development of the four kingdoms. Serbia, for instance, without an outlet to the sea, has no guarantee for her existence and economic development. Serbia demands the ports of San Giovanni, Alessio, Durazzo, which the Serb Empire possesses in the middle ages, and by which she was principally joined to the rest of Europe. In a word, we desire the partition of Turkey, Europe, leaving, however, the fate of Constantinople to the international decision of the powers."

Enlarged Their Arms. Addressing the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Austrian delegation, Count Berchtold said that the great successes gained by the Balkan States in the Balkan league, and the situation created by the victories of the Balkan States, and thus lay the foundation of a lasting and friendly understanding with them. On the other hand, we have also the right to demand that the legitimate interests of the monarchy shall be protected from the new settlement of things."

It is stated that new French proposals have in view:

(a) The recognition of the powers of the political and administrative changes in the parts occupied by the troops of the allies;

(b) The retention of the sovereignty of the Sultan at Constantinople and the region of the capital; and

(c) The summoning of a European conference in which the Balkan States would participate.
