ST. THOMAS—W. Hooper, Pastor.—Of our spiritual state we may say, that the type of piety with us, as a rule, is not so high as could be desired. We are not, however, without evidences of the Divine Presence in our assemblies. Some of our members are irregular in attendance at Prayer and Class Meetings; others appear to content themselves by attending one public service on the Sabbath. We held Special Services in the winter, followed by Cottage Prayer Meetings. A few appeared to be under serious impressions; and united on trial, but we have little abiding fruit. Our Sabbath morning Congregations are small; the evening is twice as large, as a rule. We have at present peace, and hope for prosperity. Sabbath School increases in numbers and influence, and is the most hopeful feature of things in this Mission Church. Several of our members are very liberal, but numbers are small and our debt heavy, which has a discouraging effect upon our best friends. In the midst of all we thank God and take courage.

TALBOTVILLE—R. Mallet, B. A., Pastor.—God be thanked for peace within our borders this year, and a small measure of spiritual prosperity. At Talbotville a good Parsonage has been erected, and quite a sum raised towards paying for it. A neat and commodious Church has been dedicated and almost paid for at Front Street. A good congregation attends, and a Sabbath School has been started with fair prospects of success. Finances have improved, yet leaving room for improvement. Owing to removals, and mild exercises of discipline, our membership has slightly decreased. S. S. at Talbotville is increasing. There is a prosperous future indicated for this station.

WINDSOR—W. Ayres, Pastor.—We record, with gratitude, evidence of renewed spiritual, financial and numerical prosperity. By the manifest presence and power of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit has been poured out upon us in a most blessed and glorious manner. Members greatly cheered, and numbers have united in Church fellowship with us. Several of the senior scholars in the Sabbath School have sought the pearl of greatest price, and many newly united with the Church, are already useful, distributing tracts and aiding to support the Mission.
