Quebec, Oct. 28—The first wooden ship of its kind built here since the old days of the sailing vessels, when the shipbuilding industry flourished in Quebec, was launched today at St. Laurent, Island of Orleans. The vessel is a fourmasted one, with auxiliary power, and its length over all is 223 feet, 42 feet beam and the depth of hold is 20 feet. Its tonnage is figured at about 1,350, while deadweight will be about 2,100 tons. The schooner was constructed by the Quebec Shipbuilding & Repair Company and it was named the Martin Conpany and it was named the martin Co
