

# STATUS OF LAND-DAMAGES CASE

Musquash Matter, May be Taken Up Soon, Says Lawyer.

It was said last night by J. D. P. Ewin, counsel for the New Brunswick Electric Power Commission, that the matter of arbitration for damages in regard to the expropriation of land owned by the Ingwood Pulp and Paper Co. for the Musquash hydro development would probably be heard in the next month or two. Hon. Dr. William Fugle, counsel for the company, said they were ready to proceed with the case at any time.

the company about \$59,000 on account of the loss of the land but that this offer was refused.

The company is said to have asked for an arbitration board to be appointed by mutual consent but the Commission insisted on a hearing before a judge. Judge W. B. Chandler was chosen to hear the evidence and argument but several postponements were made necessary. The final date set by Judge Chandler was April 22 and he declared that the case must be heard at that time. In the meantime his death occurred and the whole affair was set back.

Since then, according to Mr. Ewin, it has been impossible to get any judge

to set a date, but it is hoped that some settlement will be arrived at within the next one or two months.

Dr. Pugsley said that he did not believe that the judge had jurisdiction in the case. A federal law recently passed took the power away from him, he said.

Mr. Lewin, in speaking of this, said that there had been an amendment to the law and that he believed the judge had authority to hear the case and arbitrate.

## SPANISH CONSUL GIVEN LIBERTY

Montreal, Sept. 12.—Miguel Maluquer, consul for Spain in Montreal, has been granted leave to appeal from his recent conviction and sentence to six months, arising out of a shipment of alcohol which was smuggled into Canada as "pure sublime olive oil." A petition was presented to Mr. Justice Greenfield Wednesday by his solicitors, Brown, Montgomery and McMichael, with N. K. Laflamme, K. C., as counsel, and was granted bail, being fixed at \$5,000. The Spanish vice-consul at New York, telegraphed R. L. Calder, K. C., that his Government would again deposit its \$5,000 cheque, so Mr. Maluquer will again be at liberty.
