Referring to the pulp and paper question, in which he knew the visitors were vitally interested, the lieutenant-governor said he would not refer to the extravagant statements regarding a boy-cott of coal if a greater supply of pulp were not forthcoming, made by some in the country to the south, but said the government of Canada would be prepared to deal with the matter in a friendly spirit and do the best in its Dower for both countries.

So far as Canada Itself was concerned, he said, the federal government had no more power to govern the export of pulp from the different provinces than had the republic of China. Under the British North America Act, all rights and privileges to the provincial crown lands are vested in the provinces. Last vear Canada produced pulp valued at \$125,000,000 and of this quantity only fifteen per cent was retained for home consumption, eighty-five per cent. went to the consumers in the United States.
