Smallpox is again spreading in New York. It is particularly severe in the district known as "Little Italy," from 112th atreet to richt street, and from Fifth avenue to the East river.

There were quite a number of accidents during the crushes in London Saturday. Individual hospitals have admitted as many as thirty cases. Several persons were badly hurt through falling from elev-ated places.



ed. Systematic protection of the forests against fires is an issue before the New jersey Legislature. The total forest area of New Jersey is more than 2,000,000 acres, which is believed to be larger in propor-tion to its size than that of any other of the middle states. The proposed preventa-tive measures will follow the general lines of a suggestion made by Gifford Pinchot, an autkority on forestry, which involves a system of fire lanes, to be patrolled daily by wardens.




