EARLY CABLES HIGHER—EXPORT DEMAND FAIRLY ACTIVE—REPORTS FROM SOUTH WEST OF DAMAGE TO WHEAT PLANT.

Chicago, March 25.

Market opened down this morning on the large Argentinian wheat shipments, milder weather in the Northwest, and a little foreign selling.

European demand has of late been increasing with every slight reaction in values. This inquiry is particularly marked in England. Notwithstanding the heavy export from the Argentinian, crop reports have been more active of late, and extreme crop damage is reported in the Southwest.

These damage reports, however, must be taken for what they are worth, as no positive estimate can at present be formed of the size of the crop.

The wheat and corn crops are admittedly enormous and with a continued good local demand, thereby assuring fair prices for the products, farmers will in all probability continue sending their grain to market in ever increasing quantities.

Although the short interest has covered to a certain extent, there is still outstanding enough short contracts with which to make it rather unpleasant for the bears. Those who have bought on weak spots are holding on for a higher level, which will no doubt come before long.
