CAUCHON, *Lieut. Col Hon. Joseph. C.*

Descended from a member of the *Conseil Supérieur*, who came to Canada in 1636. A son of this gentleman, Cauchon de Laverdière, was Judge of the *Cour Royale*, at the Island of Orleans, P. Q. B at St. Rochs, Quebec, 31st Dec., 1816. Ed. at the Seminary of that city. M. first, Miss Lemieux, of Quebec, (she died in 1864,) secondly, in 1866, Miss Nolan, of the same city. Edited *Le Canadien* newspaper, from 1841 to 1842, and in the latter year founded *Le Journal de Québec*, of which he is still editor and proprietor. Called to the Bar of L. C., 1843. Is Lieut. Col. of the 9th Batt. of Volunteer Militia, or *Chasseurs de Québec*. Has been Mayor of Quebec for some years. Is author of *Notions Élémentaires de Physique*, (Que. 1841;) *Etudes sur l'Union Projetée des Provinces Britanniques de l'Amérique du Nord*, (Do., 1858); and *L'Union des Provinces de l'Amérique Britannique du Nord*, (Do., 1865.) Was Commissioner of Crown Lands, Can., from Jan., 1855, to April, 1857; and Commissioner of Public Works, Can., from June, 1861, to May, 1862. Appointed a mem. of the Senate and Speaker of that body, 5 Nov., 1867. Sat for Montmorenci in Leg. Assembly, Can., from 1844, until the Union, when he was returned for Commons and
