McCAIN, HUGH HENRY (Carleton).

Of Irish parentage. B. at Florenceville 1854. Ed. in the District Schools. M. Frances Kilpatrick. Is a dealer in farm produce. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1895. A Liberal.—Florenceville.

McLeod, John (St. John County).

B. at Greenock, Scot., in 1825, and came to Can. with his parents in 1826. M. Miss Alward, of Havelock. Followed a sea-faring occupation for some years; in Australia at the gold mines 1852-7. Since 1862 has carried on a business of shipbuilding. Was a mem. of St. John Conneil for 20 years. First returned to Ho. of Assem. in 1892, and re elected 1895. A. Liberal.—Black River, N. B.

MITCHELL, Hon. James, Q.C., M.A. (Charlotte).

S. of William Mitchell, a native of Inverkip, Renfrew, Scot., who came to N.B. in 1827, and settled at Scotch settlement, York Co. B. there 16 March, 1843. Ed. in the Common School, afterwards at the Collegiate School. and at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, where he graduated 1867. M., 17 Dec., 1873, Miss Ryder of St. Stephen, N.B. Called to the Bar, N.B., 1870. Apptd. Q.C. by Dominion Government, 4 Feb., 1891. Is a mem. of the Senate of the University of N.B. Was Inspector of Schools for Charlotte Co. from 1872 to 1875, and from 1877 to 1879; has been Secretary of St. Stephen School Board. and was a Census Commr. in 1881. First returned to the Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1882. Apptd. a mem. of the Ex. Council and Surveyor General, 3 March, 1883. Resigned Surveyor-Generalship, and was apptd. Provl. Sectv. Receiver General and Commr. for Agriculture, Feb., 1890. Re-elected by acclamation, 26 March, 1883, and re-elected at g. e., 1886, and at g. e., 1890, 1892 and 1895 by acclamation. On the resignation of Hon. A. G. Blair, he became Premier and Attorney-General, 17 July, 1896. A Liberal-Conservative. - St. Stephen, N.B.

Morrow, David (Sunbury).

S. of G. O. Morrow, farmer, and Elizabeth Wood, his wife. B. at Burton, 1834. Has been a lumberer and a farmer, and a mem. of the Municipal Council. Twice an unsuccessful candidate for the Ho. of Assem. First returned at g. e., 1895. An Independent Conservative—Oromotto.
