## An Act to provide for the better organisation of Agricultural Societies in Upper Canada.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Legislature passed Preamble-during the now last Session provide during the now last Session, provision was made for the establishment of a Board of Agriculture in Upper Canada; And whereas to enable the said Board to ac-5 complish the objects for which it was established, it is necessary to reorganise the Agricultural Societies of Upper Canada, and to provide a uniform system for their more efficient working: Be it therefore enacted, &c.,

That the Act of the Legislature passed in the eighth s Vict. c. 54, 10 year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for the repealed. " encouragement of Agricultural Societies and Agriculture " in Upper Canada," be and the same is hereby repealed.

## COUNTY SOCIETIES.

II. And be it enacted, That a County Agricultural So- County Societies how 15 ciety may be organised in each of the Counties of Upper organized. Canada, whenever fifty persons shall become members thereof, by signing a declaration in the form of the Schedule A, to this Act annexed, and subscribing each not less than five shillings annually to the funds of the said 20 Society.

III. And be it enacted, That the object of the said So- Objects of cieties, and of the Township or Branch Societies in con- County and of Branch nection therewith, shall be to encourage improvement in or Township Agriculture, by holding meetings for discussion, and for Societies.

25 hearing lectures on subjects connected with the theory and practice of improved husbandry; by promoting the circulation of the agricultural periodicals published in the Province; by importing seeds, plants and animals of new and valuable kinds; by offering prizes for essays on

- 30 questions of scientific inquiry relating to agriculture; and by awarding premiums for excellence in the raising or introduction of stock, the invention or improvement of agricultural implements and machines, the production of grain and all kinds of vegetables, and generally for excel-
- 35 lence in any agricultural production or operation; and it shall not be lawful to expend the funds of the Societies, derived from subscriptions of members, or the public grant, for any object inconsistent with those above mentioned.
