On an account including such a variety of items it would be difficult to detail at length the particulars of overcharge; having, however, given the claim their attentive and careful consideration, and making deductions from those items which the Commissioners apprehend to be overcharged, giving at the same time credit to the statement of the claimant as to the cause of difference in the amount above alluded to, they have thought that this demand should be allowed to the extent of 350 l.

- No. 5. Nicholas Burrows.—This claim appears to the Commissioners to be satisfactorily sustained by the evidence, and they recommend its allowance as stated, 331. 5s. 3d.
- No. 6. Michael Murnan.—This claim appears to be satisfactorily sustained by the evidence, and is recommended to be allowed as stated, 7l. 4s.
- No. 7. June Milligan.—This claim appears to be satisfactorily sustained by the evidence, and is recommended to be allowed as stated, 9 l.
- No. 8. Clarke Gamble, Esq.—This claim appears to be satisfactorily sustained by the evidence, and is recommended to be allowed as stated, 125l.
