we put our foot down. Sometimes a man has to do what a man has to do.

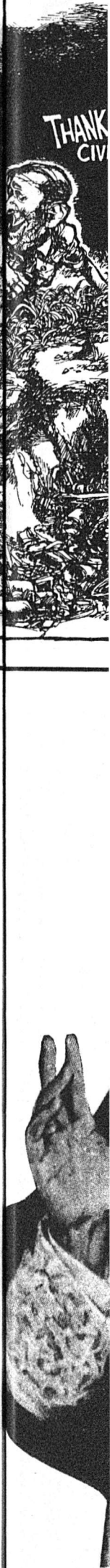
