

## Holiday pleasure skating

All local arenas with the exception of the new Clarkson rink will have a full program of pleasure skating over the holiday season.

All will be closed on Christmas Day to observe the holiday but times has been made available on other days at most rinks to give the beginner and experienced skater a whirl around the ice.

Huron Park Arena will operate at its regular times throughout the holidays.

Pleasure skating times at Huron Park are 10:30 to 12:00 a.m. Wednesdays 7:30 to 9 p.m. Fridays; 8 to 9:30 p.m. Saturdays; and 2:15 to 4 p.m. Sundays, -family day. On family days everyone from one family is admitted under the group price of 99 cents.

There will also be skating at Huron Park on Dec. 23, 24, 28, 30 and 31 from 1 to 2:30 p.m., as a holiday special.

At Malton Arena public skating takes place Tuesdays, 10 to 11:30 a.m. and Fridays, 7:15 to 8:15 p.m. (children under 12) and 8:30 to 10 p.m. (teenagers and adults), Sunday from 2:15 to 4 p.m. is family day and the same deal applies as at Huron Park.

Malton's holiday times are from 1 to 2:30 p.m. on Dec. 23, 24, 28, 29, 30 and 31.

Although Clarkson Arena opens for hockey Jan. 2, pleasure skating will not start until Wed. Jan. 6 at 10 to 11:30 a.m. and 9 to 10:30 p.m. (adults only).

Friday and Saturday skating is from 7 to 9 p.m. while Sunday afternoon is set aside for family skating with the group

rate once again coming into effect.

Dixie Arena has pleasure skating every Friday night from 7:15 to 10 p.m. The first 45 minutes are reserved for children and their parents.

Adults take over at 8 p.m. but children do not have to go home.

On Monday mornings the arena gives two hours of free ice time from 10 to 12 for all pre-schoolers and any interested adults.

Arena manager Cliff Jenkins reports there will be no skating Christmas night but that the arena will be open for business as usual on New Year's night.

### FREE TIME

The Kinsmen have been kind enough at Streetsville Arena to buy and donate ice time to the public for Dec. 28, 29, 30 and 31 between 2 and 4 p.m.

Knud Larsen, the arena's new manager, reports there will be skating as usual on Friday nights between 7:15 and 9:15 p.m. with the exclusion of Christmas and New Year's.

The regular time on Sundays between 2 and 4 p.m. will remain in effect except for Jan. 3 when the Streetsville Junior B hockey team is planning a "family" day at the Arena featuring a game between Oakville and Streetsville. All children accompanied by an adult will be admitted free.

There will be no change at Port Credit Arena where public skating is held between 10:15 and 11:30 a.m. on Saturdays and 3:15 to 4:30 p.m. on Sundays.

## Peel won't be stuck with bills if Mississauga becomes a city

Fears that Peel County might be stuck with Mississauga's county development bill, if the town was elevated to "city" status, were allayed Thursday by Warden Ivor McMullin.

Reporting on a meeting with Highways Minister George Gomme and Municipal Affairs Minister Darcy McKeough, the warden told council that an agreement could be signed between the two municipal authorities to sort out who paid what.

He said the Municipal Act ruled that a board of arbitration be set up to deal with assets and liabilities and added: "I am reasonably certain that in the advent of Mississauga becoming a city, there would be a board of arbitration and agreements could be drawn up for roads that have to be debentured."

Streetsville Mayor Hazel McCallion said agreements should, rather than could, be drafted between the

county and Mississauga. The town made application for "city" status after

Streetsville applied to the provincial government to annex almost 10,000 acres.
