



Riding Report

Since the Easter recess began I have been asked many times to explain what has been going on in Ottawa since the election, and you have a right to know.

The first 75 days of the 29th Parliament have ended with little concrete legislation to show for the hours of debate and the pages of Hansard.

The Liberal-NDP coalition's concern with the game of survival has prevented the introduction of necessary, but controversial, legislation.

The bulk of the legislation introduced this session can be divided into two main groups. The first group contains measures announced in the Throne Speech or purportedly undertaken at the insistence of the NDP. These include the increases in old age and veterans pensions, the foreign investment review bill, the establishment of a

committee to investigate food prices.

The second group contains housekeeping and remedial legislation. These include the bill to extend the ban on capital punishment, the amendments to unemployment legislation, the income tax bills, and supply bills.

The progress achieved in the government's legislation programme can be most clearly seen if we look at the completed and incompleted house business (legislation) so far this session.

C-124 — Unemployment Insurance Act, 1971 (No. 1) Amendment (removing the \$800 million ceiling), C-127 — Pilotage Act Amendment, C-141 — Appropriation Act No. 1 (Supplementary Estimates "A"), C-166 — Appropriation Act No. 2 (Interim Supply), C-164 — Appropriation Act No. 3 (Supplementary

Estimates "B"), C-147 — Old Age Security Amendment, C-148 — War Veterans Allowance Amendment, C-170 — Income Tax Act, C-171 — Excise Tax Act, C-172 — Customs Tariff, C-3 — Export Development Act, C-130 — Emergency Gold Mining Assistance, C-178 — Public Service Staff Relations.

NOT PASSED

C-2 — Capital Punishment, C-129 — Crop Insurance Act, C-164 — CNR Financing, C-128 — Aeronautics Act.

IN COMMITTEE

C-132 — Foreign Investment Review, C-133 — National Housing Act.

BILLS PROMISED

C-4 — Fisheries Development, C-125 — Unemployment Insurance Act, 1971 (No. 2), C-131 — An Act Respecting Wildlife in Canada, C-135 — Residential Mortgage, C-176 — Wiretapping Act, C-177 — Judges Act.

The government has also introduced several resolutions in the House. The first one proposed the establishment of a special committee to examine trends in food prices.

The final report by this committee recommended the establishment of a

Review Board to control spiralling food costs. The Conservative Party opposed this part of the report as being useless. We feel that food costs are only a small part of the total inflation problem. So we recommend a 90 day freeze on all wages and prices except fresh food.

This would enable the government to talk with various groups across the country to determine ways and means to solve inflation in Canada. This proposal was rejected by the Liberals and NDP in favour of the Committee's report and suggested establishment of a Prices Review Board.

On February 1st, the government introduced a motion regarding Canadian participation in the I.C.C.S. for an initial period of 60 days. As a result of a Conservative amendment that any decision concerning further Canadian participation be affirmed by the House, and a subsequent NDP motion adding with-resolutions in the House. The Government did not proceed with this debate beyond the token one-day debate, and did not consult the House when it reaffirmed its participation for another 60 days.
