Called upon.

Adverting to the Circumstances
which we have represented in our said
Petition, relative to the purchase of a portion
of our Hunting Grounds by the Upper
Canada Government, and which was
Clandestinely sold to them, by the Mississauga
Tribe of Indians, without our knowledge,
We await the result of the inquiry which
our Father has promised, (in His Answer
of the 23^d April 1840) to institute into
our Complaints on this point. —

We beg have most humbly to
represent to our Father that the
Hunting Grounds of the Mississaugas
Extended on all the Waters taking
their sources on the South side of
certain Heights of Land and flowing into
the St. Lawrence, and the Waters from
the same Height of Land which flow
into the Ottawa, pass through the
Hunting Grounds of the Algonquin
and Mississinague Tribes. —

The Mississaugas have
never Attempted to hunt near our
Grounds, neither have we ever
encroached on their Lands, this course
was observed in consequence of a
Treaty between the Chiefs of the
Mississaugas and us, of which
the Ojibwa Tribe are perfectly
Cognizant. — When our Father the
Governor General is made
acquainted
