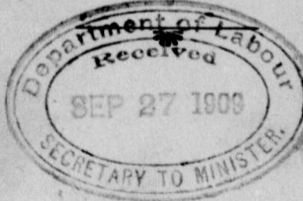

My dear Dr. King:-

I beg a thousand pardons for delay in acknowledging your kind note and accompanying contribution. Our treasurer will acknowledge the latter and I hope that your ideal in the former will be realized in the contributions of the many to swell our finances, for if we carry out our programme in sending petition and a letter to the places and persons we decided upon it will get pretty well on towards a thousand dollars.

I am sending you a specimen letter which will go to the different parties indicated and the last one is a carbon copy of a special appeal directly from Sir William and myself to men high in the business world and men of wealth who we think would be willing to assist.

The "Globe" has promised to take the matter up strongly, though the doing so seems to be a little delayed. I hope the "Globe" will strike a note that will give leadership to a great many newspapers throughout the whole country. The most of the literature is completed and is being gradually forwarded through the post. *It* will amount to about thirteen thousand pieces. Surely the result will be a Canada awakened to the question of peace.
