appellants and their mode of carrying on their business be as oppressive as is alleged (on which Their Lordships expressed no opinion), then the evil if it exists, may be capable of cure by legislation or by competition, but in their view, not by ar lostion. It is not for them to suggest what form the legislation should take, or by what methods the necessary competition should be established. These matters may, they think, besafely left to the ingenuity and enterprise of the Canadian people."
