2nd The contest lasted 7 yrs an actual war with a claim

3rd That long state had restored (not abandoned) struggle for Egyptian

ground. - only possible ground for forcible intervention when reason & force failed.

That the commerce of neutrals was so seriously endangered by the piracy resulting from the disputed possession of the Levant, & the general anarchy consequent upon the prolonged contest, as to require more vigorous measures of repress - than the Porte was willing to undertake of 3 powers based on 3 grounds

(1) request of one party

(2) ground of humanity to stop effusion of blood

(3) the 2nd party piracy & anarchy.

Turkey & Egypt, 1832

Struggle between the Porte & the too powerful subject, Mehmet Ali, the vizier of Egypt - the Sultan compelled to apply to Eng. for assistance - It came at a time when we did not find a fav. ans. - the Sultan left to himself & worse defeat followed, without an army, without resources & with
