

Given dimensions that a sufficient number of acres have been brought under cultivation and that the lot has been continuously occupied for three years, as per the conditions of sale printed on the Land Receipt.

The assignments should be entered as per specimens copy and must form part of the Land Return.

I have also to tell you that your account for percentages should not be mixed with your Land Return. The same may be said of the Macat Bailiff's account, as well as that of your Contingent account. These three accounts must be kept entirely apart from the Land Return, and also from each other and sent to the Department under separate covering letters.
