The following Courses are offered :

I. Three Years' Courses for a Diploma in

- (A.) Mining Engineering.
- (B.) Analytical Chemistry and Assaying.

II. Four Years' Courses for a Degree in

- (A.) Mining Engineering.
- (B.) Chemistry and Mineralogy.
- (C.) Mineralogy and Geology.

III. Post-Graduate Courses for the Degree of Doctor of Science (D. Sc.) For further information see the calendar of Queen's University for 1897-98.

IV. Prospector's Course.

The School offers to Mine Foremen, Assayers, Prospectors and Mining Men generally, Special Courses of instruction, beginning January 4th, 1898, and continuing eight weeks.

V. Extramural Classes for Prospectors and Mining Men.

Lecturers are sent to Mining Centres to conduct Classes in Elementary Chemistry, Mineralogy and Geology as applied to the discovery and winning of valuable minerals.

The School is provided with well equipped Laboratories for the study of Chemical Analysis, Assaying, Blowpiping, Mineralogy, Petrography and Drawing. In the Mining Laboratory the operations of Crushing, Amalgamating, Concentrating, Chlorinating and Cyaniding can be studied on a large scale, and large lots (one to five tons) of ore can be tested.
