The order of the day, for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, upon the Bill for the destruction of Thistles and other weeds, noxious to the Agriculture of this Province, being read:—

The House resolved itself into the said Committee;

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair of the Committee,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

And Mr. Pyke reported; that the Committee had made furtherprogress, and had directed him to move for leave to sit again.

ORDERED, That the said Committee have leave to sit again on Friday.

On motion of Mr. Mondelet, seconded by Mr. Rocheblave,

Ordered, That the Petition of fundry Electors of the County of York, be now brought up.

Accordingly the said Petition was received and read by the Clerk.

SETTING FORTH:—That by His Majesty's Proclamation, given at the Castle of St. Lewis, in the City of Quebec, the seventeenth day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, and in the thirty-second year of his Majesty's reign, for dividing the said Province of Lower-Canada into Districts, Counties, Circles or Towns and Townships, and for declaring and sixing the number of Representatives to be chosen for each, to serve in the Assembly of the said Province, in consequence of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the thirty-first year of His Majesty's reign,
