Government as by Law happily effablished in this Pro-

- An Act further to continue, the Acts therein mentioned, respecting Aliens, and certain Subjects of His Majefty, who have resided in France, coming into this Province, or residing therein.
- AN ACT further to continue the ACts therein mentioned, for making a temporary provision for the regulation of trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land or inland navigation.
- AN ACT to correct an accidental error in the Act therein mentioned, for the relief of Inlane perfons and others.
- An Act to declare the forty stalls erected by order of the Magiftrates of the city of *Montreal*, on the new Market Place, to be in lieu of, and confidered as, the Market House with stalls, intended by an Act of the forty seventh year of His Majesty's reign, chapter seventh, and to put in force the other provisions of the faid Act.

And then His Excellency was pleafed to make the following Speech to both Houtes; viz.

"Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and "Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

"THE advanced state of the Seafon, your private convenience, and the happy change that has taken place in the relations between His Majefty's Government and that of the United States, from which we may reatonably look for a permanence of the public tranquility, together with other circumftances, have induced me to put an end to this Seffion: and upon a full confideration of the events by which it has been marked, I feel it to be a duty which I owe to His Majefty and to the Province, to recur as fpeedily as circumftances will permit, to the fenfeof His Subjects, by calling a new Parliament.
