JAPAN READY TO STRIKE ON SUNDAY NEXT

German Embassy in Tokio is Preparing to Leave for Home

[By Special Wire to the Courier] TOKIO, Aug. 21.—Japan is quietly preparing for eventualities, following the expiration next Sunday of her ultimatum to Germany, demanding the withdrawal of German warships from the Orient

The activities at the German embassy, where personal effects are being packed for shipment, are the only indication of what the answer of Germany will be. Mean while notwithstanding the most sensational reports of the treatment of Japanese in Germany, there is no evidence of any German feeling here.

The war and navy departments are preparing for a move on Kiaochow, where, contrary to current reports, the fortifications are really formidable.

The Japanese newspapers and leading Japanese express surprise at the tone of the American press that attributes sinister motives to Japan in sending an ultimatum to Germany.

Baron Fiichi Shibusawa, president of the American Japanese Association and Buel Nakano, vice-president of the same organization and president of the Tokio chamber of commerce, are heading a movement intended to reassure China of Japan's pacific intentions.

18,000 FRIENDS OF FRANCE ARE ALL VOLUNTEERS

Striking Spectacle of Foreigners Lined Up in Paris To-day.

[By Special Wire to the Courier] PARIS, Aug. 21.—1.30 p.m.—The great square fronting the Invalides in Paris to-day presented a striking spectacle when 18,000 foreign volunteers assembled in orderly formation under the flags of their various nations to be mustered in.

Only those volunteers resident in Paris presented themselves to-day. It will take several days to comply with all the formalities and examinations and make the men into anything like an organized body of troops.

ROUGH JOURNEY BY AMERICAN IN GERMANY

Saw 6,000 French Prisoners and Trenches for Many Miles.

[By Special Wire to the Courier] LONDON, Aug. 21.—8.25 a.m.—Martin of Chicago, who left here a week ago for Munich to bring out his niece, Miss Stone, also of Chicago, returned to London this morning.

During this journey we actually were within the lines of the German army. At one point between Cologne and Crefeld we passed entrenched being rapidly thrown up by thousands of troops.

We arrived in Cologne Tuesday night after having run 250 miles during the day. We pushed on to Crefeld. The highway was congested with guns, ambulances and munitions of war of all kinds.

We were stopped dozens of times. This last stage of our return journey was the most difficult of all. As we were travelling on a war highway in the immediate rear of a great battle-field, we were stopped dozens of times.

LONDON, Aug. 21.—8.25 a.m.—The Amsterdam correspondent of The Chronicle telegraphing yesterday said that Antwerp was being put in a state of defense and being provisioned for a siege. He adds that it was stated at the office of the general staff, Thursday that all foreign correspondents found in Belgium after last night would be shot.

ENTER CAPITAL TO-DAY LONDON, Aug. 21.—2.54 a.m.—A telegram from Ostend, Belgium, to The Daily Mail last night said the main body of the German army around Brussels camped for the night, just outside the city, which already had been formally occupied by a small advance guard.
