MONTREAL, July 22.—The increasing demand for luxuries is partly responsible for the present depression in business, according to M. Lapointe. Secretary of the Quebec Division of Canada, who has recently been investigating this question for members of the Association.

"The great difficulty is that people without the means insist on maintaining and operating motor cars," declared Mr. Lapointe.
