

## Notes of Goderich.

Goderich is situated at the mouth of the Maitland river, on Lake Huron. The scenery along the valley is lovely, the river winding its way from a southeasterly direction extending for some miles, with a large and good harbor protected by two piers extending out into the lake for 1,000 feet, also lighthouses and breakwaters. A life boat and life saving apparatus is provided by the Government. The cliff is about 150 feet above water mark, reached by the incline for vehicles and also by steps from small but very beautiful parks on each side of the ravine. A large lighthouse crowns the top of the cliff. The town is rather awkwardly laid out, or rather it seems so to one used to the more modern square plan. It is in the shape of a wheel, with the courthouse and a large grassy space for the centre. This is called The Square but it is really a circle. The four main streets are named respectively, East, West, North and South, with short streets intervening. Some time after the town had begun to grow the square plan was followed, and in the more modern parts the streets are wide with abundance of shade trees, but no wood sidewalks. These are handsome and owing to the bonedown being out by hove law mowers, it is rather disagreeable work walking the streets after daylight. It has one advantage, however, does not grow long enough to be disagreeable during a rainy spell. Anyway it is preferable to running the risk of breaking one's limbs by loose boards on the side walks, in our own Royal City. There are many fine residences in and around Goderich, mostly built of wood, but there are several built of a dirty kind of brick, which detract from the beauty of the place. The most prominent building is the new postoffice now building on West street. It is built of Guelph stone and is a substantial, neat, and handsome structure. The Dominion Government evidently does not expect the town to grow as they have only erected a building for the present which will, after the extension of the C. P. R. from Guelph, be totally inadequate. The court house is a dismal looking building, not near so imposing as our own court house on Woolwich street. There are many unused acres of land which are an eye sore, and which give the place a forlorn appearance. There is a large agricultural park and baseball, and lacrosse grounds, also a fine cemetery. The High School is an imposing building, and there is talk of converting it into a Collegiate Institute. There are two Methodist churches, Knox (Presbyterian), Church of England and Roman Catholic, and a Baptist, and also a Gaelic church. The officers in charge of the Salvation Army are our own Capt. Wm. Dyson and wife. There seems to be quite a large number of trades, judging from the appearance of the wharves, which are now fully stored with piles of sawn lumber. The usual foundries, flour mills and other works which are found in cities of the lake. It is also the place of call for all the large lines of lake steamers, both Canadian and American. As a health seeking resort it has, quite a reputation with Americans, and families cross the lake every summer and take up their abode in Goderich. The heat is nicely tempered by the breezes from the lake, and on the fine evening scenes of boats on the water for either pleasure or fishing, the mouth of the river being crowded with followers of old Isaac either in boats or on the breakwater.

## Smallpox on Board Ship.

QUEBEC, July 5.—Information was received here last night that a ship with smallpox on board had been detained yesterday at the quarantine station at Grosse Ile. Inquiry elicited the fact that the vessel in question was the barque Saragoga, which sailed from Montreal on May 7th for this port in ballast. She was towed as far as Grosse Ile by the tug Beaver. Two of the Saragoga's crew died of the disease on the passage out and were buried at sea. Another is still down with the disease. The Beaver was permitted to return to port, but not until all her crew had been vaccinated.

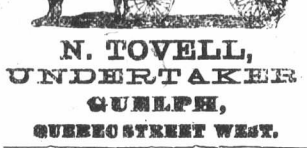
