Napondent From Long III Janes Dickens Takes The Own Life

The saddest tragedy that has happened on the Miramichi for years wurred at Douglastown about non-Monday, when James Dickens, a respected resident, in a fit of melanchdila induced by ill health, shot himself to death at his own home s eldest son, a fine young man on the C G R staff at Moneton, had been spending the Easter holidays at his home, and was to leave for Moneton that afternoon and the family sat down to dinner Mr Dickens at the time was upstairs in his bedroom and upon being calied replied * that he would be down in a moment The family faished their meal and shortappearance of Mr Dickens one member of the family rushed upstairs to see what was keeping him, and found him fying on the floor, and life almost extinct

The late Mr Dickens had been ill since New Years and had been noticeably despondent at times He was a popular citizen and an honored member of Newcastle Lodge No 93, I O O F His widow, and eight children, his mother and two brothers survive Deceased was 43 years of age
