## Brigade Football.

CADETS WIN.

The C. C. C. defeated the Highlanders on St. George's Field last evening by two goals to none in the opening game of the Brigade Division. There was a regular 'bride attendance', showing that greater interest is manifested in these matches than in the senior league contests. Precisely at 7 o'clock at the sound of the foot the teams came together. Living up as follows:—

C. C. C.—goal, Phalen; backs, J. Walsh, Thompson; halves, Christopher, W. Hart, Joy; forwards, W. Caul, J. Kent, F. Phalen, B. Hart and E. Murphy.

When the ball was put in motion the Highlanders brought it to their opponents' territory and kept it there for several minutes until Phalen, Caul and Kent captured it and made a splendid run down field. Mercer was called upon to save and in clearing gave a corner, but nothing of any account resulted. On the kick off the Kitties put on a vigorous rush and used their best endeavours to get the ball past Phalen but without success. They got a few corners which were poorly placed. The Cadet forwards made several good rushes which proved futile. Honours were evenly divided and the teams crossed at half time with no goals scored.

SECOND HALF.

On resumption of play the C. C. C. lads appeared to be in better form and played better combination. For several minutes the Highlanders goal was bombarded, when from a "free kick" placed by Hart, Kent scored the first goal.

The Highlanders on re-centering put vim into their play but could not score. About two minutes before the final whistle sounded Caul sent in the No. 2 for the Cadets, and no further scoring was done.

The game was well worth witnessing. The teams are evenly matched, but the Cadets seemed to combine best.


