A schooner laden with cordwood from the Bay of Quinte, ran around upon the island at Toronto on Friday night. She had a crew of seven men, two of whom remained in the rigging all night, the other five staying below. All were taken off the next morning by Wm. Ward and Berry (the well known coloured oarsmen) though at imminent risk to the lives of their preservers. The boat was twice swamped, and it was only by almost superhuman exertions that the last two men were saved. The schooner is a total wreck.

The Quebec Legislature is further progued to the 15th January.
