

ATTACKED BY THE BEASTS

Savage Pets Make an Onslaught On Their Trainers.

Two Men and a Woman Attached to a Show Seriously Injured.

Cleveland, June 9 .- Three animal trainers attached to an animal show had thrilling experiences here Saturday with their savage pets, and as a result one man, the lion trainer, Jos. McPhee, is fatally injured with great holes in his abdomen made by the teeth of a lion. The others injured are Herman Wedder, whose right leg was fatally crushed by a bear, and Madame Morelli, whose right arm and side were lacerated by a leopard. The animals had been shipped from Boston to this city, and were surly and ugly. They were being transferred from the railway cars to their cages when the

casualties happened. Wedder was the first to be injured when he entered the cage of a big bear, which received him with a swipe of his immense paw, knocking him to the floor, where the bear pounced upon him and fastened his teeth into his right leg, tearing off so large a chunk as to make necessary, surgeons say, amputation of the injured limb. Madame Morelli, who entered her cage of leopards, was received in a similar manner to Wedder, only that

one of her pets leaped upon her shoul-der and lacerated her right arm se-verely. Madame Morelli was lying on the floor when the attendants came to her assistance, and with pikes drove the spotted beast off, not, however, without its making another attempt at the woman's life, for, just as the door was about to be closed between the animal and the woman, the leopard again made a leap at her.

HORRIBLY LACERATED. The lion tamer, McPhee, was watching the transfer of the lions from the car to their cage, and because they refupsed to move promptly he entered the cage. He had hardly entered be-fore a great beast leaped upon him, pinning him to the floor. The lion placed his great paws upon the fallen man's breast and tore his right leg in a fearful manner, the tendons being pulled from the bone. The efforts of the attendants to

McPhee removed from the cage more dead than alive. He was removed to an improvised hospital arrangement, and physicians who were called say that he is surely fatally injured.

### Male Valets.

A new manifestation of the servant question is the substitution by women while traveling of a valet or a trained nurse for a lady's maid. "You don't mean to tell me," cried a conservative elderly woman to her up-to-date granddaughter, "that wo-

men in good society put a man into the place of a lady's maid?" "Certainly I do," was the calm re-joinder. "Just as they prefer often-times the man milliner, dressmaker, habitmaker, tailor and hairdresser. "Of course, the duties of a woman's 'valet and a lady's maid are not exactly the same, but the principal difference seems to be that those of the

valet are more inclusive." One reason for the rise of the valet spend six months or more every year away from home and travel without male escort has increased tremendous-ly of late and that few who can afford it consider their traveling equipment complete without a lady's maid. As a result the supply of lady's maids is short of the demand. Therefore, valets are employed as a substitute. The average lady's maid is not a good traveler. Neither is she resourceful in emergencies, and she is not quick to promote the comfort of her employer under unexpected condi-

She shines only within the boundaries of the boudoir, and is generally considered a treasure if she no more than keep the clothing of her mistress mended and brushed, dress her hair, assist at her toilet, and pack and unpack her trunks. In return for these services she gets anywhere from

\$30 to \$50 a month. Indeed, some women go so far as to say that outside of the private apartments of her mistress the lady's maid is more of a hindrance than a help while traveling, whereas the valet may be depended on for many services, such as running errands, carrying sachels and bundles, interviewing porters and baggagemen, and bearding the railroad ticket agent in his den. He is also willing to engage his own quarters and meals without bothering his mistress, is not over particular as to softness of his mattress or the quality of his food, and last, but not least, does not complain of being lone-

He can pack trunks, not excepting the bonnet-box, those who know him best declare, even more skillfully than a woman; and, without breaking down under the strain, he will keep the gown, boots and shoes of his mistress immaculately brushed, dress her hair, and on occasion fetch and carry hot water and meal trays-a task a lady's maid rejects with of-fended dignity.

In short, the woman's valet, who must by no means be confounded with the man's valet, is a remarkably useperson, and because of the satisfaction he is giving he seems to be in a fair way to become popular.-Chicago Chronicle.

## THE METROPOLIS IN GRATEFUL MOOD

Thanksgiving Services in St. Paul's and Other Churches.

KING AND QUEEN TAKE PART

And Wore Joined at the Cathedral by Others of the Royal Family.

London, June 8 .- The noisy jubilation with which London has resounded for the last week was succeeded today by more subdued, although not less impressive, public demonstrations of thankfulness for the return of peace in South Africa. The thanksgiving services in London today were typical of the services held throughout the empire, but the presence of King Edward and other members of the royal family at the principal devotional service in London and the progress of the royal personages to and from St. Paul's Cathedral through cheering thousands of British subjects and visitors in London, gave thanksgiving day in the metropolis the added feature of a notable historic occasion.

MORNING PROGRAMME. The programme of this morning was not intended to be accompanied by special estentation. King Edward and Queen Alexandra did not pass through the streets even in semi-state, but rode to St. Paul's in an ordinary landau, drawn by four horses, accompanied by postillions and outriders. Only those members of the royal family who reside in Buckingham Palace accom-

panied their majesties. The Prince and Princess of Wales and others proceeded to St. Paul's separately, but by the same route as did their majesties. The King and the Queen were joined at the cathedral by the Prince and Princess of Wales and many other distinguished personages. Although the weather was chilly the streets for the entire distance from the palace to the cathedral were thickly lined with people, who bared their heads and cheered as the royal family

THE KING WARMLY GREETED. King Edward, who wore the uniform of a field marshal, was greeted with enthusiasm, and his majesty, the Prince of Wales and the other princes were busily engaged in acknowledging salutations from the crowd.
