

TRIAL OF MCNAMARAS

Judge Decides That Manner of Extr. dition Was Legal.

Los Angeles, Cal., July 7.-John McNamara, charged with the murder

McNamara, charged with the murder of nineteen employees of the Los Angles Times by the use of dynamite, must stand trial before Judge Walter Bordwell. The prosecution scored heavily when the question of jurisdiction, raised by the defence, was decided against it.

Judge Lordwell said that a person brought into the state, by colorable extradition on principle stands on the same footing as one brought into the state by kidnapping. He said that the manner of the extradition would not justify his discharging the prisoner.
