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MEMORIES OF WRECK KILL COL. GRACIE

Survivor of Titanic, Who Had Marvellous Experience, Dead at New York.

New York, Dec. 5.—Col. Archibald Gracie, a retired army officer, one of the two men who actually went down in the vortex when the Titanic sank last April, and who ascribed his escape from death to a miracle, died yesterday in his apartment in the Hotel St. Louis, 34 East Thirty-second street. Though his death is credited to a complication of diseases, his physicians and his wife and daughter, who were with him when he died, believe that Col. Gracie succumbed really because of the last reaching effects of the Titanic disaster.

The strain of these memories was also added to because Col. Gracie had only just completed his book on "The Truth About the Titanic." Ever since last April he had been in correspondence with survivors of the ill-fated liner, and the work he had written received its final corrections only last week. It is now in the hands of the printers.

Col. Gracie's story of the sinking of the Titanic was one of the most remarkable of those told by the survivors. After all the lifeboats had gone from the sinking vessel he went to the topmost deck as the boat gradually settled, and when the final wave broke over her, sending her to the bottom, he jumped with the wave.

Col. Gracie also told thrillingly of his sensations while he was underneath the surface of the sea in the great vortex caused by the sinking of the ship.

VERY COLD IN WEST

Below Zero Temperatures Recorded in Manitoba and Saskatchewan.

SUICIDE MAY CAUSE DEATH OF BROTHER

Hamilton Man, Who Entered Gas-Filled Room With Lantern, Blown Up.

Hamilton, Dec. 6.—Not knowing at the time that his brother, Robert Pottage, was lying dead in his little tailor shop over McGregor's store, 278 James street north, although suspecting something amiss owing to the fact that he could not gain an entrance, and that the windows were nailed down, Christopher Pottage almost lost his own life last night when he attempted to enter the room through a window with a lighted lantern in his hand.

His brother several hours previously had deliberately taken his own life by inhaling gas, and when Christopher forced an entrance into the room with the lantern, there was a terrific explosion, which blew him half-way out of the window, where he was found in three-quarters of a mile, then collapsed. The dead man and the victim of the explosion were brothers, and both were engaged in the tailoring business in this city. They came from Toronto a year ago.

The dead man was 22 years old and his brother is 25.

The neighbors could assign no reason for the terrible tragedy, as both the young men seemed to be very quiet and respectable. The mother was notified of the affair, and she came up from Toronto on the evening train.

KILLED HIS COMRADE THINKING HIM DEER

Hunting Tragedy in the Lost River District of Saskatchewan.

Melfort, Sask., Dec. 5.—Mistaking his companion for a deer, Hardy Brown shot and killed James Dobson in the Lost River district, 45 miles east of here, yesterday. After being shot through the lungs, Dobson walked three-quarters of a mile, then collapsed. His death occurred five hours later. Brown walked to Tisdale and reported to the authorities. An inquest is being held.

KNEW NOTHING OF A CONSPIRACY

Former Member of Ironworkers' Executive Testifies at Dynamite Trial.

Indianapolis, Dec. 5.—Accused of carrying a nitro-glycerin can from Pittsburg to Indianapolis, and of having approved of the use of union funds for purchasing explosives, Henry W. Legleitner, a defendant, testified at the "dynamite conspiracy" trial today.

Legleitner, who was arrested in Denver, was a member of the executive board of the International Association of Bridge and Structural Ironworkers from 1907 to 1910, and as such is charged with appropriating the \$1,000 paid monthly to J. J. McNamara for carrying on a "dynamiting campaign" against non-union work.

The Government alleges that McNamara had made a case especially designed to carry a ten-quart can of nitro-glycerin on passenger trains, and that Legleitner, arriving from Pittsburg, delivered the case to the ironworkers' headquarters.

The witness denied any knowledge of a conspiracy among the union officials.

DREDGE BURIED IN SLIDE AT WHEATLEY

Crew Escaped, But Had a Remarkably Close Call.

Wheatley, Dec. 5.—While working on the excavation of a large ditch about seven miles below this town, the dredge Digger, owned by a Windsor firm, was buried beneath a large sand slide. The dredge had a big bank of sand piled up on either side of her. The sand became loosened on both sides at the same time, and, giving way, buried the dredge, only her upper works showing above the sand.

No member of the crew was hurt, although one narrowly escaped being buried beneath the slide. The tug Marion E. Trotter, of Amherstburg, came to her assistance, and a gang of men are at work removing the sand.
