UNIONS WILL NOT OBSERVE LABOR DAY IN LONDON
Will Co-Operate With St. Thomas Unions in Celebrating Instead.

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For Sallow, Wrinkled, Freckled, Pimpled Skin
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HAVE RAISED \$9,000 FOR NEW CHURCH

Liberal Response to Appeal of the Ridout Street Methodists.

BUILDING STARTS SOON
Fund of \$18,000 Aimed at Before Construction Commences.

Though it is only a few weeks since the canvas was started to erect more than \$9,000 has been secured for the new Ridout Street Methodist Church. The new edifice, which will replace the old High Street Mission that was moved to Ridout street some time ago, will cost in the neighborhood of \$25,000. The members of the congregation are aiming at a fund of \$18,000 before the work of construction is started and from present indications this amount will be reached without difficulty, according to those who are active in the work of the church. The church will be the first one in which the London Methodist Council has contributed its support. The plans and specifications have been completed, and it is expected that bids will be received within a short time for the structure. It is the intention to start actual construction work as soon as possible, and the congregation expects to be in its new building before a year has passed.

Last evening, at an enthusiastic congregational meeting, every branch of the church work, the quarterly board, the trustees board, the Sunday school, the Ladies' Aid, the Epworth League and the Young Men's Club, and the other affiliated church organizations reported a most substantial increase for the past year. South London's development has been such that the church is one of the most flourishing of the smaller Methodist congregations in the city, and the pastor, Rev. A. E. Lloyd, and his parishioners are most optimistic as to its future.

TENANTS MUST VACATE POST OFFICE SITE
Are Ordered Out of Carling Block by July 1.

The remaining tenants in the Carling Block, Richmond street, acquired by the Government for the new postoffice, received notice today that they were to be out of the building by July 1, as the authorities wished to take over the entire building at that date. While the Government will take over the building on July 1 it does not mean that it will be torn down and a new one built immediately. The most of the ground floor of the structure is now being used by the postoffice department, and word was received here the other day that it may be some months before preparations are made for the tearing down or building of the new office.

WHO OWNED BOOTS?
Magistrate Unravels Tangled Question After Plea Was Changed.

Linardo Annetine, a young Italian, in police court this morning, asked through his lawyer, M. W. Flock, that the plea of "guilty" which he made last week, when charged with theft of a pair of boots, be changed to "not guilty." He said he had a written order from his brother who owned them. The defendant's brother left town some time ago, and left his brother's uncle's house, Dominico Annetine's, where he had boarded. He wrote to Linardo, telling him to get a pair of his boots from his uncle's. Linardo did this, and he was charged with theft by his uncle. Magistrate Judd and the rest of the court last week understood through Annetine's interpreter, that his brother's good were in lieu for a board bill. In the meantime M. W. Flock learned that they were legally free, and argued that Annetine did not steal the boots because he had a written order from his brother who owned them. Linardo, however, pleaded guilty to theft last week, so a magistrate's statement, and the explanation of Mr. Flock were filed with the letter. Sentence was suspended, and the boots need not be returned to the uncle.

GARSDIE INQUEST TONIGHT
Inquiry Into Fatal Leap Crossing Accident Opens at Police Headquarters.

Coroner Dr. A. MacLaren and his jury, inquiring into the death of William Garsdie, who was killed at the Grand Trunk Wellington street crossing Saturday evening, as the result of being struck by yard engine 1430, will hold an inquest at police headquarters tonight. W. E. Foster, Ontario legal representative of the railway corporation, will be present in the interests of the railway. The jurors are: Theodore Thompson, foreman; B. Tripp, A. Ashton, H. Butt, Robert Norgraves, H. Shaver, Joseph Wood, E. Lortie and A. Holland.

SENTENCE SUSPENDED
Indian Assaulter Bound Over to Keep the Peace.

Samuel K. French, the Indian from the Chippewa reserve who was committed for trial by Squire Chittick on Tuesday, on a charge of assaulting Mary Sky, appeared before Judge Talbot in the County Court this morning, and pleaded guilty, electing to be tried by judge without jury. He was allowed out on suspended sentence, bound over in \$100 to keep the peace, and in \$200 to appear for trial when called upon.

CHANGE IN COMMAND
Guelph Company of C. A. S. A. Has Been Placed Under Lieut. Steele.

Major E. C. O'Brien, commandant of No. 3 Company, Canadian Army Service Corps, Guelph, has been placed on the militia reserve. Lieut. Steele has been gazetted to succeed him in the command. Major L. CANADIAN SAILORS IN ERIE COUNTY JAIL

Held to Give Evidence Against Vessel Owners Re Immigration.
[Canadian Press.]
Buffalo, May 7.—Nineteen Canadian sailors are being detained at the Erie County jail under orders of the United States immigration officers. They are to be used as witnesses by the Government in the prosecution of vessel owners who are alleged to have violated immigration laws covering the shipping of men from foreign nations on American ships. The sailors were taken from the fleet of steamers that brought down the first cargoes of wheat from the elevators at Fort William, Ont., where most of the steamers wintered. Under the law, it is said, the men should have been discharged upon their arrival here.

EXPORTS AT ST. JOHN DECREASE IN VALUE

Winter Port Season Ends, With Exception of One Cargo.
St. John, N. B., May 7.—The winter port season has practically ended as export manifests of liners which departed during the winter have been filed at the customs house, and only one cargo remains to be forwarded, that for the New Zealand liner Southern. The value of the exports this year is less than the previous season by \$5,079,650. This year the manifest values totalled \$24,277,850 and in 1913 the total was \$29,356,880. The service this year consisted of 117 arrivals and 99 departures, with trans-Atlantic cargoes, thirteen west Indies arrivals and departures, and eighteen departures for United States ports.

WHERE DID BILLARD COMPANY GET CAPITAL?

Interstate Commission Is Endeavoring to Find Answer to This.

Washington, May 7.—John L. N. Billard, promoter of the Billard Company, alleged to have been formed as a holding company for the New Haven, Boston and Maine and their subsidiaries, was scheduled as the principal witness at today's session of the interstate commerce commission's inquiry into the New Haven's financial operations. The commission is anxious to discover where the \$2,000,000 capital of the Billard Company came from, the belief being strong that it was furnished by the New Haven.
