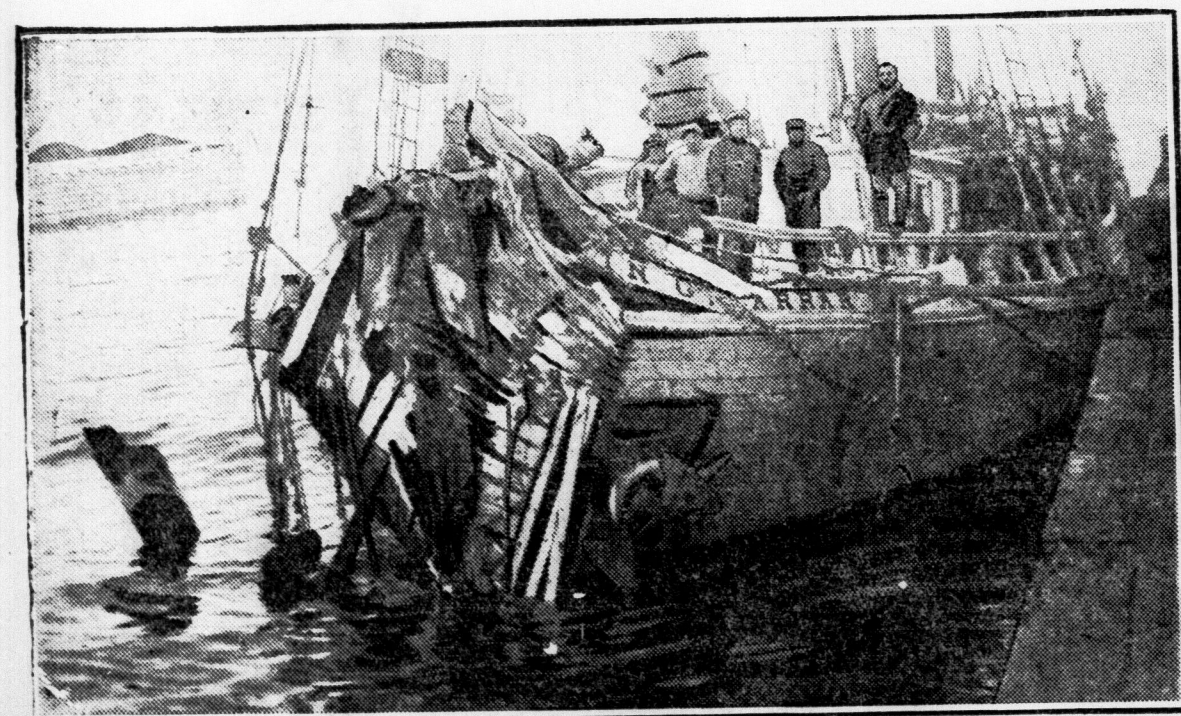
ETON WALL GAME — The Collegers and the Oppidans in their annual contest, which features the St. Andrew's Day celebrations at the famous English school.
