NOTE AND COMMENT.

The English language leads all others. More people speak it, as the following figures will show:—English is spoken by 160,000,000, German is spoken by 130,000,000, Russian is spoken by 100,000,000, French is spoken by 70,000,000, Spanish is spoken by 50,000,000, Italian is spoken by 50,000,000, Portuguese is spoken by 25,000,000.

A love of home and home life should be planted in every girl and boy, and there is no way so sure of giving this lesson than in making the home attractive and pleasant. Now, to make it attractive is not for the mother to do all the rough work and the daughter to do the trimming, but it is to have your boys and girls share the cares, experience and labors of the home. Teach them every detail, give them a personal interest. Lay a foundation early, for it will be slow work, requiring patience through oft multiplied failures.

Unfamiliarity with the provisions of the new marriage Act on the part of clergymen and issuers of marriage licenses is causing more or less com-

plaint to provincial authorities. The section objected to is that prohibiting the marriage of non-residents except when preceded by three weeks' advertisement in local newspapers. A number of ministers appealed to by persons from outside the province who are anxious to wed have laid the matter before Dr. J. W. S. McCullough, Deputy Registrar-General. The Registrar, in reply, is emphasizing the provision of the Act allowing bona fide marriages to be performed without the three weeks' delay by securing permission from the Provincial Department. "All the applicants for a license have to do," said Dr. McCullough, "is to ask the issuer to apply to the Registrar-General. This application may be made in writing, by telegraph, or telephone, and will be attended to at once. I know of no bone fide case in which it has been refused." Since the Act went into force the number of marriages along the border, which had much to do with the passing of the legislation, has decreased by one-third. Young people from the American side are still showing a preference for Canadian marriages, but the new law has eliminated much of the machine-like marrying of elopers that raised such a scandal at Windsor and other points.
