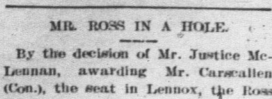

MR. ROSS IN A HOLE

By the decision of Mr. Justice McLenan, awarding Mr. Caracallen (Con.), the seat in Lennox, the Ross Government's majority is reduced to one. The same judge, however, refused to believe that four famous ballots in North Grey had been tampered with after they had been deposited by the electors in the ballot box. He awarded the seat to Mr. McKay (Lab.), but reduced his majority from five to two. It will be remembered in connection with the North Grey case, that County Judge Morrison expressed the opinion that the ballots had been tampered with between election day and the day of the recount held by him.

In connection with St. Vincent Div. No. 9 in North Forey, the Deputy Returning Officer (Lab.) and the Liberal and Conservative scrutineers have taken affidavits to the effect that they had not seen any ballots with two crosses on them nor counted any such for Mr. Boyd; that in that division no envelopes had been provided in which to place the ballots and that they had been placed in the ballot box loose and the box sealed. The strange part of the affair is that when the recount was held and the box opened, the loose ballots were found to be in envelopes, showing clearly that some one without authority had handled them between election day and the recount.

In giving his decision, Justice McLenan had none of this evidence before him. In fact, he could not ask it. Therefore, a scrutiny will be demanded when the ballots will be traced and the electors asked to swear if they placed two crosses on them. St. Vincent is not a big division and every man has been canvassed and the people there unhesitatingly declare that the ballots were tampered with. Seeing what the Ross machine has been guilty of in the past and knowing that it was active during the election, there are good grounds for believing that Mr. Boyd was defrauded of the seat.
