



We write to report the sale of our grand stock boar Leicester buke to N H Gentry of Sedaha, Mo, for \$500. Mr Gentry bought him to show at the head of his herd at the World's Fair at New Orleans, and that, too, without seeing him, he purchased him on our recommendation alone. We are pleased at his success at the World's Fair, as he won first prize for best boar over two years, sweepstakes for best Berkshire boar and headed one first prize herd of one boar and six sows. He also won gold medal for the heaviest hog in the show, beating the Poland Chamas and Jeisey reds by 10 lb. We think this a grand victory infavor of the attle Berkshires, so called by breeders of other breeds of swine. Mr. Gentry won all the prizes for which he competed, and that was for nearly all offered. We are pleased at his success, as all the jugs shown by him, with one exception, were toought from us, or bred direct from our stock.

Mr. T. C. Patteson reports business brisk and the enquiries for Shorthorn bulls more numerous than in any preceding year. 


