

The Commonwealth Education Liaison Committee is the body established in accordance with recommendations of the first Commonwealth Conference to enable governments to consider together the development of the schemes of educational assistance which the Conference had agreed upon. It comprises one representative of each Commonwealth government together with one member representing United Kingdom colonial territories and co-opted members under Sir Philip Morris (Vice-Chancellor of Bristol University) as independent Chairman.

The Commonwealth Education Liaison Committee and the governments concerned have under consideration the content of the agenda for the Second Commonwealth Education Conference and the level at which it should be held.
