—O *Legislative Councillors, Quebec*—Same provisions as above, *mutatis mutandis*, 74.

Dissentient Schools—See Education.

Distribution of Legislative Powers—

—*Powers of Parliament*—Parliament may legislate on all subjects not exclusively assigned to Legislatures; and exclusively on the 29 classes of subjects enumerated in 91 section, also on local works and undertakings specified in paragraph 10 of 92 sec. Also on Education, 93—See Education—Uniformity of Laws.

—*Powers of Legislatures*—They may legislate exclusively on the 16 classes of subjects enumerated in 92 sec. On Education, Immigration and Agriculture, under the restrictions contained in sections 93, 95.

Division of Records, &c.—See Records, &c.

Divorce.—See Marriage.

Documents, &c.—Of the late Province of Canada—See Records.

Dredges, Steamboats and Public Vessels—Belong to Canada, 108 — See 3rd Schedule, (10).

Drill Sheds, Armories and Lands—Set apart for public purposes belong to Canada, 108.—See 3rd Schedule (10).

Duplicate of every Proclamation, &c.—Announcing Royal Assent to a Reserved Bill, is to be delivered to the proper officer, to be kept among the Records of Canada, 57. The above provisions apply to the Provinces, 90.

Duration of House of Commons, 5 years, 50.

—*Of Legislative Assemblies, Ontario or Quebec*, 4 years, 85.
