ROADBED INADEQUATE

Mayor Tells How City is Burdened With Heavy Repair Charges.

Submission to the voters on Jan. 1 of a bylaw to purchase the lake shore road was decided upon by the board of control yesterday.

Acting City Treasurer Patterson reported that paving and repairs at street railway tracks for the three years 1910-12 cost \$968,890.

"It is costing us \$300,000 a year to keep up the surface paving and repairs for 100 miles of street railway tracks," Mayor Hocken commented.

To assist in the furnishing of the new building of the infants' Home and Infirmary, a grant of \$7000 will be made.

The North Riverside Ratepayers' Association asked that the Tomdornen district be annexed, the boundaries to be St. Clair avenue on the north and the Scarborough line on the east.

By unanimous vote, \$5000 is to be contributed to the relief of the families of the victims of the recent hurricane on the great lakes.

McGuire testified that he had heard forty or more charges of contractors being forced to make contributions to politicians.

What McGuire had heard had included charges that forty-three contractors had been appointed to make contributions to politicians.

McGuire corroborated his previous testimony that he had given Sulzer \$3,500. Of this sum, he said, \$2,500 was given "out of sympathy" last June when the governor sent him and told him he needed money.

SARNIA, Nov. 19.—(Special).—The freighter Howard M. Hanna, aground near the lighthouse at Port Austin, has been released according to the statements received here today from the underwriters at Cleveland.
