TRYING TO KILL PEOPLE NEGLECT ON WATERFRONT

Anyone Can Fall in Near the Bay-street Docks—Railway Crossing Is Very Dangerous.

If there is not an accident on or near the new ferry dock at the foot of Bay-street it will not be because the authorities are not guilty of criminal negligence in the care of island traffic. In the first place, at the railway crossing at the foot of Bay-street, far more dangerous than at the foot of Yonge, is left entirely unprotected from shunting passenger and freight trains, which is going on at this point at all hours of the night or day. he gates are a perfect nuisance, for at times people get caught between the gates and the shunting cars. What is needed is a man with a flag stationed at both entrances to protect the island crowds from instant death.

Then, again, for 100 yards the sidewalk runs along the edge of water fully 20 feet deep. There is no rail, not even a plank raised to protect children or even grown-up folk from accidentally falling in the drink, and especially at night. It is a crying shame, but, as usual, nothing will be done in the matter until a few lives are sacrificed. Where is Aid-Thomas Langton Church?

POLICE PROTECT TEAMSTERS
Annual Convention Divided Into Two Factions.

Chicago, Aug. 7.—When the teamsters' convention opened for the second day's session, policemen in citizens' clothes were stationed on the stairs leading to the hall, uniformed men in the street below, and reserves in the city hall across the street. This force was not to protect property or non-union men, but to protect the drivers themselves and prevent disorders in their convention. Opposing factions, one headed by President Cornelius P. Shea, and the other by Albert Young, Shea's chief rival for the office of president, lined up on a preliminary issue of the election, and the vote showed the Shea contingent numbered 112, as against 83 for the Young forces.

EVERYONE FOR HIMSELF
Survivors Say Captain of Ship Was One of the First in Lifboat.

Madrid, Aug. 7.—According to the statements of some of the survivors of the wrecked Italian steamer, Sirio, the captain of the vessel came from his cabin immediately following the first shock, hesitated whether to go to bow or stern, or mount the bridge, and then turned and jumped into a lifeboat, crying "Everyone for himself!" Thereupon began a terrible struggle among the passengers for possession of the boats and lifeboats. The crew, with knives between their teeth and officers, with revolvers in their hands, saved themselves.

TO PUNISH LYNCHERS.

Governor Sends Troops to Prevent Possible Rescue.

Raleigh, N. C., Aug. 7.—This afternoon Gov. Glenn received a telegram from Judge B. F. Long at Salisbury, stating that one person had been identified as a member of the mob that lynched the alleged murderers of the Lenoir family last night, and that he had been placed in jail; that evidence was in hand against others, and that the investigation is being pushed as rapidly and thoroughly as possible. The governor received this message from Sheriff Julian of Rowan County: "Send one hundred armed men here at once to assist me in maintaining order."

The governor wired the militia companies at Charlotte and Statesville to proceed at once to Salisbury by special train and guard the jail to prevent the liberation of any alleged lynchers arrested.

JAPS RAISE MIKASA
Togo's Flagship, Finally Is Saved for Navy.

Tokio, Aug. 7.—It is reported from Sasebo that, after repeated failures, the battleship Mikasa, which sank last September after an explosion had occurred on board, was successfully floated to-day.

The Mikasa was the flagship of Admiral Togo at the battle of the Sea of Japan. She sank after an explosion at Sasebo, September 11 last. Considerable mystery surrounded the cause of the disaster, on which hundreds of lives were lost, this generally accepted figures being 256 killed or missing, and 345 more or less seriously injured.

LEFT BY THE DEAD.
In the surrogate court yesterday, the will of the late E. L. King, one of the victims of the Salisbury disaster, was filed for probate. The estate amounts to a little over \$4000. Mrs. King is sole executrix and only beneficiary.

William Dandy, a school teacher of this city, left an estate of \$7111, which goes to the widow and John B. Dandy, a son. The estate includes the property at 106 Bernard-avenue.

Charles Nixon left an estate of \$6000, but no will. The property will be divided equally among Mrs. Nixon, three sons and two daughters.

Pitched Battle With Tartars.
Tiflis, Aug. 6.—Tartars fought a pitched battle with Russian troops last night. The combat lasted until this morning, and the Tartars were 200 strong, and occupied favorable positions.

Unanimous.
Rio de Janeiro, Aug. 7.—The international American conference, at its session to-day, unanimously adopted the arbitration project.

HEAT WAVE BROKEN

Four Deaths in New York and Many Prostrations.

New York, Aug. 7.—There was some relief this forenoon from the torrid weather conditions which have prevailed here for three days.

Throughout last night every breathing spot in the city was crowded with sweating humanity. The parks were packed, and many persons on the east side slept on fire escapes, and even on the sidewalks. Men, women and children surrounded the public fountains during the night.

Two persons who were sleeping on fire escapes fell to the street and were killed. At noon four deaths, due to the heat, and many prostrations had been reported.

Crane, it is believed, by the heat, James Dupo, 33 years old, a tailor living on East 12th-street, to-day shot and killed his wife, Agurora, aged 20 years, and then sent a bullet through his own brain. He was removed to a hospital in a dying condition.

FORTY-EIGHT PROSTRATED.
Philadelphia, Aug. 7.—Two deaths from heat occurred to-day before 9 o'clock, making a total of nine fatalities since the beginning of the present hot and humid wave.

At the various hospitals a total of forty-eight cases of heat prostration were reported.

120 AT WASHINGTON.
Washington, Aug. 7.—In some parts of this city today, thermometers registered 120 degrees. There were many prostrations.

Suspender Holds Him Down.
Watertown, N. Y., Aug. 7.—Cornelius Smith, aged 30 years, of Deer River, was drowned in the stream of the same name last night.

Smith, who was in a boat with another man, stood up in the craft, lost his balance and fell into the water. The body was recovered this morning, and was found to have been held to the bottom by his suspender catching on a sunken limb.

Cure for Tramp Nuisance.
Ottawa, Aug. 7.—Mr. Larke reports from Sydney that a tramp reformatory is to be established by New South Wales. Tramps are to be put upon a farm and fed on bread and water. If they want better food they must work for it. When one is spontaneously willing to work he is to be discharged as cured.
