The postomee authorities are now in possession of upwards of \$1000 sent by Canadians, who were duped by circular letters.

During the past few weeks, men, women and children over the country have been receiving letters from the Rogers' Manufacturing Co. of Niagara Falls, Ont., stating that the address was the winner of a prize which would be sent to him if 97 cents were forwarded for packing and postage. Hundreds of people were taken in and sent their money to the postoffice
