McIntyre & Wardwell send the following despatch to their branch office in Toronto:

There was no feature to the afternoon market until very near the close, when there was active trading and sharp decline in Tobacco. It is said the price of "Dice" brand, with which the trust is fighting opposition brands in the west, is to be reduced to 12c per lb., which is away below the cost of manufacture. Foreign exchange firmer to-day, all around 4.88% for demand sterling. The engagement of \$500,000 gold for export to-morrow wass announced. Silver shows further strength to-day, and dealers generally look for further improvement. There was a surplus of \$500,000 over Rock Island's 2 per cent. dividend, against a deficit in 1895, when 3 per cent. was paid on the stock. It is stated a large decrease in operating expenses came out of conducting transportation, and not from final tenance of the property. The Senate is expected to follow the House and pass the Kiver and Harbor bl. over the President's veto to-day. There has been selling to-day of both stocks and bonds, notably in Kansas & Texas, and Atchison, for Amsterdam account. Germany has also sold. The break in Tobacco unsettled the closing of the market, which has been firming upon shorts covering.
