London, April 9.—The Anglo-French agreement signed yesterday provides the following solution of the French shore question: 1. France renounces her rights to French shore with the exception of the right of cleaning and drying fish on the shore. 2. France retains the right of fishing in the territorial waters of

the French shore. 3. France secures on the other hand the right of French fishermen to obtain supplies of bait on that coast, the right to fish in these waters not only for cod, but's for lobsters, which are raised to the dignity of fish; the right of shipowners and sailors, whose interests will be im-paired by the new state of things, to indemnity in an amount which will be determined by a commission of French and British naval offi-cers, with the opportunity of an option of an appeal to an arbitrator, to be designated by The Hague Tribunal. 
