VARIOUS CAPITALS AGOG

Czar Said to Have Even Made In-

quiries as to Japan's Probable

Terms.

Washington, June 8.—(5 p.m.)—Pending

negotiations for the peace in the

far east have assumed within a few

hours an unexpectedly favorable phase.

While it might be too much to say at

this moment that peace is in sight, in

view of the delicacy of the exchanges

now in progress, it is certain that there

is great hope now for a successful

termination of the present negotiations

British Ambassador Durand's con-

ference to-day with the president last

evening was a success. As he left the

White House he said that it would be im-

possible for him to attempt to throw any

light on the progress of peace negotia-

tions. He had no definite information

himself, he said, and indicated that it

was not surprising that the president

should be asked to throw any light on

the progress of the negotiations. The

ambassador, however, would be the last

one to whom the president would take

an active part in the negotiations for a

cessation of hostilities in the east.
