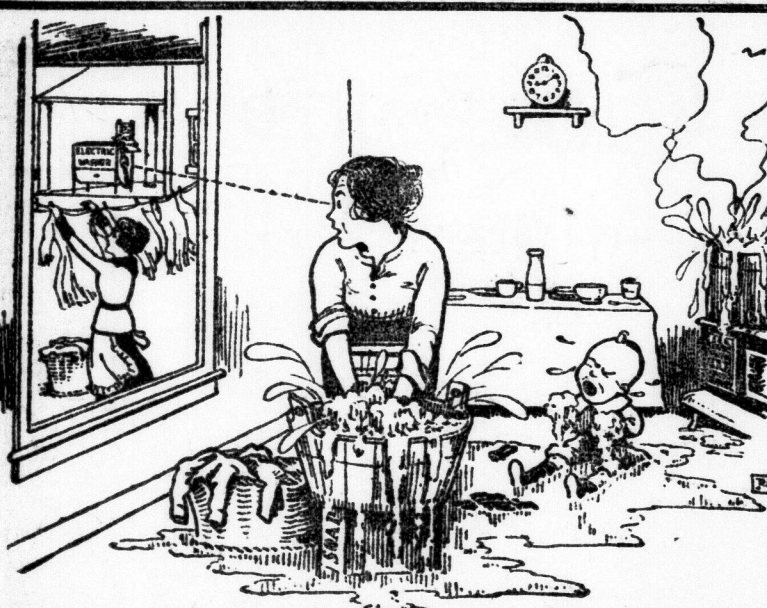

## EIGHT POLICE RAIDS IN DETROIT SUNDAY

One Woman, 169 Men and  
100 Quarts of Whiskey  
Seized.

DETROIT, Mich., March 21.—Between 9 o'clock Saturday night and 5 o'clock this morning, the police "clean-up" squad conducted eight successful raids in Detroit resorts, principally in the downtown district, and 169 men and one woman were caught in the net. Nearly one hundred quarts of whiskey as well as a considerable quantity of gambling paraphernalia was confiscated.

The largest haul was made at 87 Woodward avenue, where "Doc" Clarke's "Athletic Club" yielded 37 men. At the Waiters' Union Hall on John R. street, 35 men and a faro outfit were seized. Two Griswold street barbers were found to be camouflagees for gambling rooms. At the Ros Hotel, 75 West High street, officers found two cases of whiskey. The raids are part of a general plan of Police Commissioner Ingham to clean up the town.

**STRONG EARTHQUAKE.**

## PUNISH GUILTY OF REVOLUTION, EBERT PURPOSE

German President Voices De-  
termination To Prosecute  
Higher-Up Offenders.

### STRIKERS' AGREEMENT

Resume Work—One Condition  
Is That Coal Industry Be  
Nationalized.

STUTTGART, March 21.—(By the Associated Press.)—The immensity of the damage caused in Germany by the revolution and the consequent uprising, and the Government's present determination to prosecute the guilty were voiced by President Ebert today.

"I am realistic enough to think that the damage has not been catastrophic, and that is also the opinion of the cabinet," Herr Ebert said. "I am sorry the events of the last few days have proved there are still circles in Germany that think the distress of the lost war not great enough. They are the same groups that always desired war; they are the inciters of the militarists and reactionaries."

Regarding the punishment of the Kapp leaders and the expectation of some that the state of siege would make necessary the execution of the guilty, the president declared:

"Those guilty shall feel the full weight of the law. All officers of responsible position and all leading figures who joined willingly with the regarded as guilty, be charged with high treason, and might be punished with penal servitude."

Regarding the resumption of work under martial law, Herr Ebert said:

"The strikers will determine. Perhaps some will be executed, besides the confiscation of their property. We want to punish the leaders, but to spare those who were forced into the movement or acted through ignorance."

The president said it would take time to restore complete quiet, but declared he was quite confident all would be well. He expressed his thanks to the foreign governments for their attitude during the crisis, and especially to France and Austria, which countries sent diplomatic representatives to Stuttgart, and to England, whose representative from the beginning dealt with the old government.

A governmental announcement today gives the terms of the agreement reached by Chancellor Bauer and other government representatives with the leaders of the striking elements in Berlin.

**Enumerates Eight Points.**  
The statement enumerates eight points to which the government agreed in order to secure a cessation of the general strike. The points follow:

Revision of the cabinet.  
Disarmament and punishment of those who participated in the Kapp revolution.

Changes in the personnel of certain federal offices.  
Speedy democratization of the entire administration.

Enactment of new social legislation.  
Immediate nationalization of the coal, potash and other industries, and the campaign against food hoarders and profiteers.

Disbandment of disloyal military units and the substitution of democratic organizations without class distinction.

The document concludes with the phrase:

"We learn that Ministers Noske and Heine (Gustav Noske, minister of defence, and Dr. Karl Heine, Prussian minister of the interior), have tendered their resignations."

## FLOOD RECEDING AT MOUTH OF THAMES, ICE JAM BREAKING

People of Prairie Siding Can  
Appreciate Story of Noah's  
Rejoicing.

CHATHAM, March 21.—Noah, in the Biblical story of old days may have been elated when he saw the dove return with the olive branch, but he had nothing on the people of Prairie Siding and district for gratitude when they looked out of their bedroom windows this morning and saw that the flood had subsided about two feet during the night. "It is like finding a new world," said the head of one family which had been marooned for three days, over the telephone to the correspondent, and he echoed the sentiments of the families who have been in the same predicament.

**ICE JAM BREAKS.**  
The ice jam in the River Thames, the cause of the flood, broke partially early today, and from that time the water has steadily receded. It is expected that blasting operations, which have been in effect during the past few days will be more successful tomorrow.

Reports received from various other points this afternoon were to the effect that the water has fallen from three to four feet, and that land again visible in some of the flooded sections. The water is two feet below the G. T. tracks and the trains are running again. The river has receded about six feet in the city since yesterday.

### LIFE'S NECESSARIES GO STEADILY UPWARD

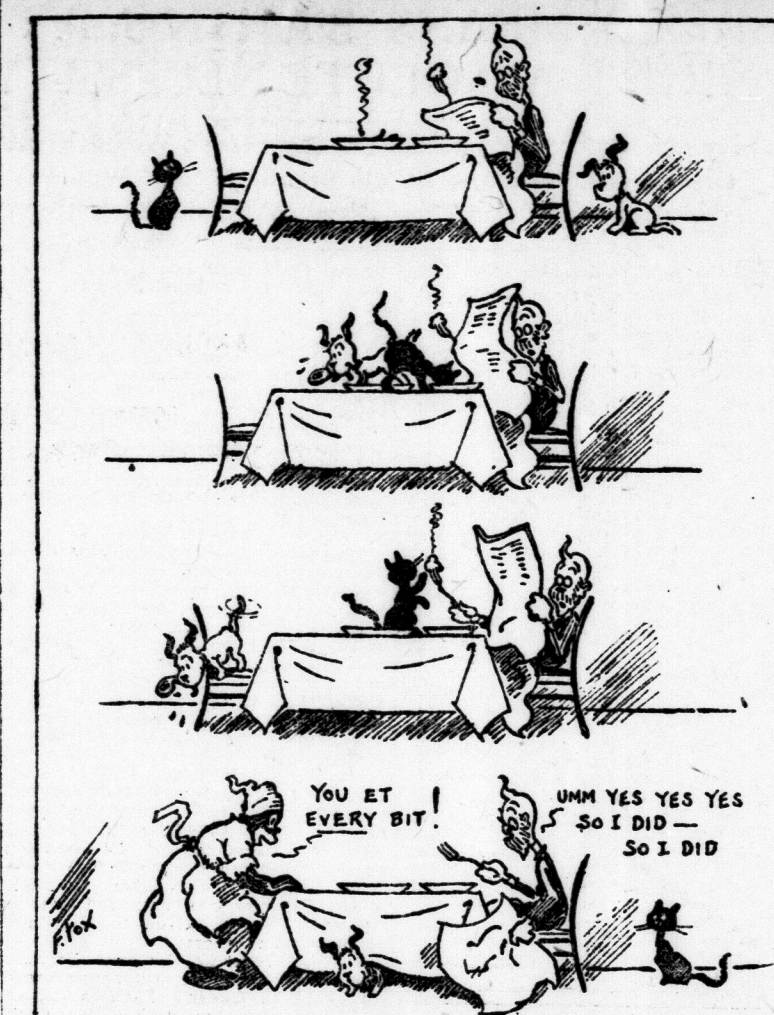
OTTAWA, March 20.—Another marked increase in prices of the necessities of life during February is noted in the Labor Gazette for March just issued. Practically every one of the essentials of domestic life, including building materials, fuel, and food, shows a movement in price "steeply upward," says the Gazette. "The family food budget in some sixty cities averaged \$15.70 at the middle of February, as compared with \$15.30 in January, \$15.41 in February, 1919, and \$7.75 in February, 1914.

## FARMERS TO OPPOSE MACKENZIE KING IN NORTH YORK, BELIEF

Call Convention To Nominate  
Burnaby For Next  
Election.

TORONTO, March 21.—The farmers will oppose Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, liberal leader, in North York at the next federal elections. A convention has been called for April 10 for the nomination of a candidate.
