THREE DEAD. HUNDRED

Socialist Deputy Injured in a Clash With Police.

PARIS, May 2. - Official figures issued today give the casualties resulting from the disorders yesterday as three dead and 102 wounded, of whom six remain in hospitals, two of them in a dangerous condition. The arrests aggregated 103.

The foreigners among those arrested are to be deported. are to be deported.

Alexandre Blanc, Extreme Socialist deputy, who was injured in yesterday's clash with the police, will be prosecuted on a charge of abuse of the peace. Immunity, it is declared, will not apply to his case, which it is asserted was a flagrant offence.

M. Blanc was one of the deputies who met the Germans in Switzerland during the war at an international Socialist conference.

CLASH WITH GUARDS.

PARIS, May 1.—A clash between Republican guards, police and 2,000 May Day manifestants occurred at 3 o'clock this afternoon on the boulevards of the St. Mantin quarter. Two shots were fired during the melee and several persons are reported wounded. The disturbance was the first active disorder of the day. It was brought on by the presence of students from the schools, who acted as drivers on the auto busses, replacing the striking drivers.

Toward 3 o'clock crowds along the route of the autos began jeering the student drivers. They then began stoning the windows of the auto busses, spitting in the faces of the drivers of the buses which had been stopped by the jam of people in the streets.

The crowds grew until they numbered 2,000, bringing the auto bus service entirely to a halt. A small cavalry patrol came up, but was unable to deal with the crowd, which continued stoning the vehicles until drivers and passengers abandoned the buses in the streets.

MINERS, DOCKMEN

TO JOIN RAIL STRIKE

PARIS, May 2.—(By the Associated Press.)—The strike of the railroadmen for nationalization of the railroadmen for nationalization of the railways, which is to be joined tomorrow by the miners and dockmen, has resulted thus far in hindering traffic only on four of the big systems—the Eastern, Northern, Orleans and the Paris-Lyons & Mediterranean. Temporarily, however, the state line which runs to Havre is tied up. "The strike is a complete failure," said Yves Le Trocquer, the minister of public works, today.

Services on all lines were curtailed today. The Parisian es were operated about 50 per cent, except the Lazarre State system, which cancelled all trains from the capital.

To Fight Strike

The Government's determination to fight the strike for nationalization has been voiced by M. Le Trocquer and Premier Millerand. M. Millerand said the Government was prepared to do its duty in the maintenance of order and to protect the men who remain at work. M. Le Trocquer expressed confidence in the outcome of the situation. He explained that he had foreseen the conflict, and that, as a result the railways, public services and industries had been provided with greater supplies of coal than they had had at any time since the signing of the armistice.

Requisition Trucks.




