

ST. THOMAS, Aug. 9.-The Sunday street car service was severely criticized by Rev. Dr. Henderson of the Central Methodist Church last night. He deprecated the action of Mayor Brinkman in acceding to the reques of some people in the city without asking the approval of citizens who were just as much interested in a quiet Sabbath as others. Dr. Henderson had called up the mayor and demanded his authority for a violation of the law, but the mayor acknowledged that he was responsible and would take the consequences. The doctor charged the noise of the cars with disturbing the Sunday Silence, and the movement was opposed by many people. Verdict States Four-Year-Old Girl Died by Strangulation.

WITNESSES ARE HEARD

Possible Motive of Revenge Is Claimed by One Who Testifies.

ST. CATHARINES, Aug. 9.-After 50 minutes' deliberation this afternoon coroner's jury of Thorold returned verdict to the effect that Margalet Boucock, aged 4, whose decomposed body was found on the route of the Welland Ship Canal last Wednesday, size 25c. At all dealers or sent postpaid came to her death by strangulation on by Fruit-a-tives, Limited, Ottawa. the afternoon or evening of July 13 last, and expressed the opinion that her death was caused by the hands of David McNeal, in whose company she was seen walking towards the spot where the body was found.

Dr. J. T. Vanderburgh, who performed the post-mortem examination in company with Dr. Publow, read his report. He explained that the body was very badly decomposed. Examination proved that the dress was intact. Under the dress was a little waist. The bloomers were not attached to it, but were below the child's knees. There was a piece of cotton about five inches wide and about a yard long, tied with a single knot with a second double knot lying directly at the back of the child's neck. The head had been severed from the body, but whether or not by decomposition Dr. Vanderburgh could not say.

Several witnesses were called for the crown. Robert Bradley testified that last winter McNeal told him that there was one man that he wanted to get even with, and that one was Reuben Boucock. He said that Boucock was instrumental in having him put out of a Mrs. Clarke's house.

George H. Peterson, who acted for McNeal, objected to such evidence beling taken.
